- Two fantastic days on a working cattle station in the beautiful Arcadia Valley, with a tagalong tour guided by the owners Rowan and Madeleine Pert, as well as a home cooked camp oven dinner and show. We will also have a movie under the stars.
- Once again our friends Ray and Glenda at Anakie are rolling out the red carpet for us, by allowing the Tag-alongers to fish in their private lake for Barra, fossick on their own claim, and finally saying farewell over a sausage sizzle, compliments of the Park. You will love the shack out at the lake!
- The city of Charters Towers will be of great interest to anyone with a fascination in the history of the "Roaring Days" and gold mining in Queensland. There is so much to see here that you could easily spend a week uncovering the many historic treasures of this city, which was once the second largest in Queensland.
- The vast black soil plains of the north unfold before us as we head out through Julia Creek then North towards the Gulf and the town of Normanton, where we will ride the famous "Gulflander" train to the deserted mining field of "Critters Camp", so named because of the hordes of insects that abounded there. - We turn our wheels to the East towards Croydon, Mt. Surprise and the beautiful Atherton Tableland. Bring your jumpers as the Tableland is usually about ten degrees cooler than Cairns. Lots to see and do up here.
- The grand finale is definitely Cooktown. So named as it was here that Captain Cook on his voyage spent a couple of months repairing his ship the Endeavour. Highlights are a special re-enactment of Cooks visit, put on as a special event just for our Taggers. A visit to the iconic Lions Den Hotel, just south of Cooktown is well worth the drive. It seems like yesterday we were on tag-along no.4, but here we are uploading the itinerary and registration form for tag-along no.5. for those of you who have travelled with us in the past, some of the information below will be 'old hat', but for those of you who will be joining our tag-along for the first time, this information is very important.

Please appreciate the format of this tag-along is quite different to most. For a minimal \$300 per head you will receive: -

- A season ticket to all tag-along concerts. A short bio on the three main artists who will provide the majority of your entertainment is on my website.
- A camp oven dinner and movie night.
- A dinner at one of our concerts.
- A trip on the Heritage Gulflander train. This train trip is a bonus and will be limited to the first 100 people to confirm their registration with form and payment due to the limited space on-board.

- A special meet and greet at the Miles Showgrounds and a farewell function at Cooktown.
- Numerous smokos and happy hours.
- Sausage sizzle.
- Pancake brekkie.
- A regular issue of our newssheet "Living the Dream" will be issued during the tour. It will provide you with explicit details of times and venues for shows, relevant activities etc.
- The opportunity to explore the most incredible country on this planet.

Should your circumstances change after making your booking and you need to cancel, your registration fee will be refunded in full.

Once you have registered for the tag-along you will need to organise: -

- Your accommodation – we have supplied the information on all caravan parks so you can decide where you wish to stay and make your own bookings. The Caravan Park Graham is staying at is listed in **bold print**. It is not necessary to stay at the same park as Graham, you may wish to free camp or choose another park. The main thing to remember is to make your bookings early. Many of the places we are visiting are small and facilities are limited. As you would realise, our tag-along will not be the only people wishing to stay in most of these parks. However, there should be ample unpowered sites available. **Please ensure you book well in advance and inform the park if you require a powered site for medical reasons.**
- On some days activities will be organised for us to do as a group, whether you join us or not is up to you, other days it will be a matter of free time. On these occasions you can organise activities that are on your personal bucket list.

We recommend that in the week before leaving home, you print (or download) the final edition of this document and take it on the tour with you to be used in conjunction with our periodic newssheet "Living the Dream".
